
# A Song for the Viola

#### **Program notes:**

This three-minute work functions as a window to a musical world rather than a short, musical narrative. Its material could expand in multiple directions. The work arose from a project first initiated by Ny Musikks Komponistgruppe in collaboration with violinist Mira Benjamin from Montreal in Canada.

#### **About the performance:**

A Song for the Viola can either be performed on the viola or the violin.

The instrument is amplified: a warm reverb is constructed around the sound. The nuances could be captured either with a contact microphone or a microphone on a stand, placed to point downwards on the instrument. Stereo speakers are used as the sources of the three-minute sound file and the amplified sounds. The viola is to mix with the other sounds.

The performer uses a timer.

#### **Instructions:**

On the tail piece: The sound of the bow against the tail piece is rubbery and airy. The effect

is partly visual.

XPT: 'Extreme sul pont.', extremely close to the bridge. A fragile and delicate

sound with only a little tone. Slow movement of bow. The pitch is to stay

focused and should not break or burst.

Sul pont.: Close to the bridge. The pitch is to stay focused and should not break or

burst.

Normale: Normal placement of bow.

Harmonics: Sounding pitch is notated with a circle above.

Vibrato: Lasts only through the specific note.


Tremolos:
